by Katrine Crow


Walter the whale shark is very excited for the first day of school! But when he realizes he's different from the others, he learns a very valuable lesson about standing out.

by Tammi Sauer



by Bob Shea


A boastful shark is not afraid of anything, which impresses his underwater friends until they ask about spiders.

by Ruth Galloway


Smiley Shark's toothy smile frightens the other sea animals but comes in handy when they are caught in a net.

by Chris Barton


A shark and a train compete in a series of contests on a seesaw, in hot air balloons, bowling, shooting baskets, playing hide-and-seek, and more.

by Ame Dyckman


